Identification Card Honorably Retired Peace Officers

This is an application for an identification card to identify a person as an honorably retired peace officer, as authorized by Texas Government Code, Section 614.124, Honorably Retired Peace Officer. For purposes of this application Honorably Retired means a former peace officer who:

- Previously served but is not currently serving as an elected, appointed, or employed peace officer under Art. 2.12., code of Criminal Procedure, or other law;
- Did not retire in lieu of any disciplinary action;
- Was eligible to retire from a law enforcement agency in this state or was ineligible to retire only as a result of an injury received in the course of the officer's employment with the agency; and
- Is eligible to receive a pension or annuity for service as a law enforcement officer in this state or is ineligible to receive a pension or annuity only because the law enforcement agency that employed the officer does not offer a pension or annuity to its employees.

ACTION NEEDED BY YOU:

- Read this application carefully.
- Sign the application as a verification of the accuracy of the information submitted.
- APD's Internal Affairs Commander/Designee verifies retirement status and signs below.
- Submit form to the Chief's office for approval once the information below is completed.
- Take approved application to 1124 South IH 35 (COA Housing Authority), 3rd floor, CTM Security Office.
- Report lost or stolen ID cards immediately to APD Watch Commander at 974-0913.
